





Number 4 - "Six peeping chicks cheeping cheerily"





## Quick Facts about Shakespeare

**Full name:** William Shakespeare. **Born:** Exact date unknown, but baptised 26 April 1564.

**Hometown:** Stratford-upon-Avon, England. **Occupation:** Playwright, actor and poet.

**He wrote over 37 plays and 150 poems.**

Shakespeare's plays were immediately big hits! He wrote different kinds of plays, all of which could be divided into three categories:

**Tragedy** – including *Hamlet*, *Othello*, *King Lear* and *Romeo and Juliet*


**Comedy** – including *Twelfth Night* and the *The Taming of the Shrew*

**History** – including *Henry IV*, *Henry V* and *Richard III*





***POEMS: Here are a couple of Poems about Spring Time – one for older students and one for younger! Ask your daughter/son to recite them out loud and then encourage them to use their voice in different ways – see the cue cards below! - Perhaps they could recite it to a friend or relative over the phone or on a video call!***



**A Poem for older students : Daffodils** (or, I Wandered Lonely As A Cloud) is a very famous poem by William Wordsworth, written sometime between 1804–1807. Practice saying the poem aloud. Think about using pause, facial expression, speaking clearly and using vocal expression.

### Daffodils by William Wordsworth

I wandered lonely as a cloud  
That floats on high o'er vales and hills,  
When all at once I saw a crowd,  
A host of golden daffodils;  
Beside the lake, beneath the trees,  
Fluttering and dancing in the breeze.

Continuous as the stars that shine  
and twinkle on the Milky Way,  
They stretched in never-ending line  
along the margin of a bay:  
Ten thousand saw I at a glance,  
tossing their heads in sprightly dance.

The waves beside them danced; but they  
Out-did the sparkling waves in glee:  
A poet could not be but gay,

And dances with the daffodils.






Vales – a valley





## **Bunnies!** A drama game for + 3 players. Age 3+

Firstly, choose somebody to be the seeker.

The other players (the bunnies) should make a circle, or stand apart with the seeker in the middle. The seeker must not move and can only turn on the spot.


Bunnies should now place their hands on top of their heads, like bunny ears. The bunnies must wiggle their ears at every opportunity – but make sure the seeker cannot see them moving.

Begin the game and if the seeker sees a bunny wiggling, that bunny must sit down and is out of the game. Remember- you must wiggle those ears when the seeker is not looking!!




